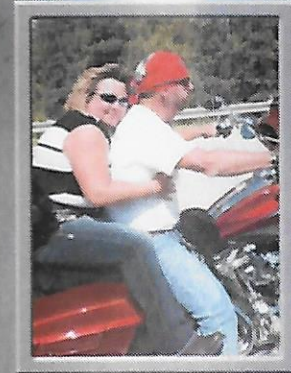

Dennis Joe Dighero, age 63, of Lamar, passed away from injuries sustained in a motorcycle accident Friday, August 7, 2015 north of Lusk, Wyoming.

He graduated from Lamar High School in 1970 and earned a bachelor's degree from Pittsburg State University.
