LAMAR, Mo. — Services will be at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon in the Bruce-Konantz chapel, for Clarence Rix, 69, retired motor car agency operator, who died at 7:15 o'clock Thursday morning at his home, 1208 Cherry street. The Rev. Wesley Arrington will officiate. Burial will be in the Iantha cemetery.

Mr. Rix was born at Hays, Kan., in 1895 and came to Lamar in 1939 from Liberal, Kan. He was a veteran of World War I and was married in Lamar to Miss Cecil Temple in 1917, who survives.
