

ICYL ELIZABETH WHITE, daughter of Dr. James A. and Addie Alexander Hope was born July 4, 1897 in Dade County, Missouri. She died Saturday afternoon, January 15, 1994 at 4:30 pm at the Altus Memorial Hospital in Altus, Oklahoma after a short illness. Icyl was preceded in death by her parents and her brothers and sister. She was 96 years, 6 months and 11 days old.

Icyl grew up and attended school at Dudenville, Missouri. In 1916 she was married to Leland Money and they had one daughter, Grace, who preceded her mother in death. On January 14, 1928 she married Hardy M. White who had two daughters, Maxine and Eileen, whom she helped raise. The family lived in Dudenville and they were involved in operating a general store. Icyl also lived in Carthage and Golden City. Her husband, Hardy, preceded her in death on May 1, 1963.

In 1983 Icyl moved to Snyder, Oklahoma to be near her daughter. Later she fell and suffered a broken hip and she became a resident of the Ayers Nursing Home in February, 1985. She lived there until her death at the Altus Memorial Hospital.

Icyl was a devout Christian, whose faith and positive attitude sustained her through many misfortunes and painful experiences including the death of her daughter in 1992 and her fall shortly before when her neck was broken. Through her grief and suffering her faith never failed and her sense of humor and wit were also lasting. She was a member of the United Methodist Church in Dudenville and talked about when she used to sing solos in church. She recalled that the first solo she sang was "Where He Leads Me, I Will Follow." This title seemed to be the guiding influence in her life. She was truly an inspiration to her family and to those who knew her well.

Her death was a release from much suffering and had been long desired by her, but she will be sorely missed. Her survivors include two step-daughters, Maxine Boehne, Carthage, Missouri and Eileen Emmerick, Long Beach, California; a grandson, Jim Stall, Comanche, Oklahoma and a granddaughter, Mary Elizabeth Disney, Gray, Kentucky; Four step-grandchildren and 6 step-great-grandchildren. Many other friends and relatives will cherish the memory of her love.
