Carl C. Castle, age 91, Lamar, Missouri, passed away at 10:15 a.m. on Sunday, January 6, 2008 at his home surrounded by his family. He was born on November 21, 1916 in Lamar, Missouri to Elbert "Bert" and Permelia (Pearl) Castle. He was a Veteran of World War II and an avid quail hunter and golfer, a Lamar city councilman, a zoning board member for many years and a loving and devoted husband and father. He served from Oct. 1941 until Oct. 1945 in the U.S. Army, 27 months of that time overseas. When he came home he first went quail hunting and then start the Castle's Shoe Shop on the square in Lamar. He was there from January 1946 until his retirement in 1977. The store is operated today by his son Scott and remains the oldest business still in its original location in Lamar. Carl was a founding member of the Lamar Country Club and love playing Golf. Carl is survived by his wife of 64 yeas, Marjorie Speedy Castle.
