

Oscar Franklin Clyman passed away at the Nevada Regional Medical Center, Nevada, Missouri on Tuesday, March 21, 2000 following a short illness. Mr. Clyman was born at Bowers Mill, Missouri on April 5, 1918, the son of Franklin Oscar Clyman and Dora Evans Clyman. He attended Sharon and Ackley Elementary Schools and graduated from Golden City High School in 1937. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II in the John Deere 608<sup>th</sup> Ordnance Base Maintenance Battalion in England, France and Belgium. He met his future wife, Phyllis Morement while serving in England and returned a year after his Army discharge on January 6, 1946 to marry Phyllis on January 6, 1947 in Warminster, England. They returned to the United States and lived on the family farm in the Dudenville Community. To this union of 53 years, two children were born. He was engaged in a crop and livestock operation until retiring and moving to Nevada, Missouri in 1992. Oscar served his community on the Sharon, Unity and Golden City School Boards for 24 years. He was a member of the Dudenville United Methodist Church and served as treasurer and Sunday School Superintendent. He joined the Nevada First Baptist Church on July 17, 1994 and enjoyed being a member of the Glory Choir.

He is survived by his wife, Phyllis, of the home, a son, David Clyman and his wife, Glenda of Nevada, a daughter, Marilyn Stockdale and her husband, John of Sheldon, Missouri, two grandsons, Jeremy Clyman and his wife, Jennifer of Blue Springs, Missouri, Jason Stockdale of Joplin, Missouri, one granddaughter, Julie Clyman of Columbia, Missouri, two sisters, Audrey Yates of Nevada and Lorene Wheat of Carthage, Missouri, nieces, nephews, cousins and many friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents.
