

James W. "Walt" Cook, 84, of rural Liberal, passed away at 7:10 p.m., Tuesday, February 19, 2002, after a one-year illness.

Walt was born February 23, 1917, in Fayetteville, Arkansas, the son of Pearl Eristice and Georgia Evelyn (Bryant) Cook.
