Aaron Gardner, 72, of Lamar, Missouri, passed away at 2:08 P.M. Thursday, May 4, 1999, at his residence after a lengthy illness.

Aaron was born August 12, 1926, near Jerico Springs, Mo., to Floyd and Zula (Beydler) Gardner. He lived all his life in the Lamar area. He was a retired field engineer for Finley Engineering Company. He was a member of the Milford Christian Church and was an U.S. Army Veteran of World War II, serving in the Pacific. He was a member of the Lamar VFW Post 3691, and the Lamar Masonic Lodge #292 AF & AM, serving as the past Master of the Milford Masonic Lodge.

During the 1950's and 60's, Aaron played and coached baseball.

Aaron married Betty Needham on July 4, 1972 in Las Vegas, Nevada. She survives of the home.
