MRS. LOLA LEE DEAD

Widow Of Bob Lee — Former Rural Mail Carrier — Two Sons Survive — Funeral Saturday Afternoon — Burial In Howell Cemetery

Mrs. Lola Lee, seventy seven, lifetime resident of Barton county, died at the Memorial hospital at 11:15 p.m., Wednesday. She was taken from her home at 1301 Cherry to the hospital last Saturday, suffering with a severe case of pneumonia. She appeared to improve, but the improvement was not sustained.

The seventy seven year old woman was born at Milford, December 23, 1885, the daughter of George and Margaret Chapman. She grew up in the community, attending the local school, and was married at Milford November 7, 1904 to Robert E. Lee, also of Milford.

The couple farmed during their earlier married life in the home community. In 1920 they moved to Lamar, where the husband took a job as a rural mail carrier out of the Lamar postoffice. He continued on the route until his health failed and he was forced to retire. He died January 2, 1941. Since that time the widow had continued to reside in their home on Cherry street in Lamar.

She was a modest, homeloving woman, deeply devoted to her husband and their two sons, Donald of the home and Gerald of Milford, both of whom survive their parents. She was a good and kind neighbor in her own unobtrusive way. She was a member of the Lamar Christian church and of the Royal Neighbor lodge.

The body was taken to the Bruce Konantz funeral home to be prepared for burial. The last rites were set for 2:00 p.m. Saturday at the Bruce Konantz chapel. Interment follows at Howell cemetery near Milford, beside the grave of the husband.
