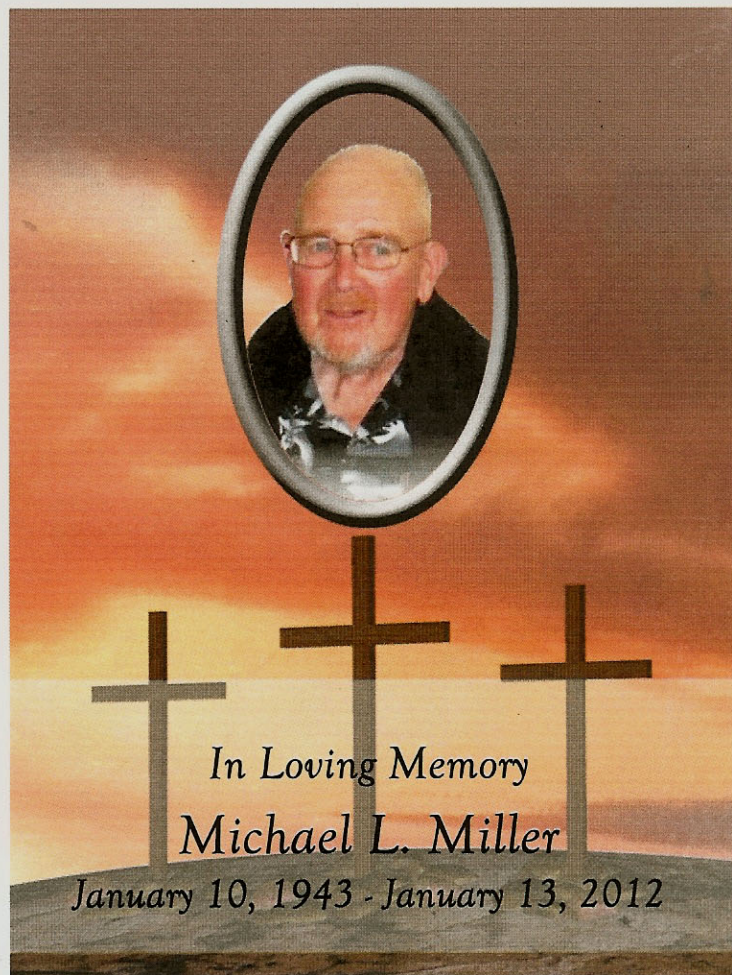

Michael L. Miller was the firstborn child of Alex A. Miller and Ruth J. (Leach) Miller in Uniontown, PA on January 10, 1943. Mike was the oldest of three children having a younger sister, Cheryl, and a younger brother, Allan. He graduated from Uniontown High School in 1960 and went on to Penn State University on an academic scholarship from Anchor Hocking Glass Corporation, graduating in 1964 with a degree in chemical engineering.

During his career, Mike had the opportunity to work with several different companies in the industrial gas industry around the country. These included Wheeling-Pittsburgh Steel in Steubenville, Ohio, The Great Plains Coal Gasification Plant in Beulah, North Dakota, AIRCO Industries, and the Compressed Gas Association in Washington, DC.

In 1965, Mike married his high school sweetheart, Margaret "Peg" Ann Romesburg. From this union, they were blessed with three sons: Dr. Erik M. Miller of Lamar, Missouri; Brett J.
