Dr. Burl Zack Pfander, DVM answered his last call on Friday, August 15, 2003, at 3:30 p.m.



This is so in line with his character, as he would never retire at night before he knew every "ill" animal he was responsible for, was treated to the best of his ability. Burl arrived on this planet on May 22, 1926, the son of John L. and Grace Pfander, who then lived in Jasper, Missouri. The Pfander family moved to a dairy farm in Barton County in the summer of 1940.

Burl graduated from Liberal High School in 1944 and was immediately drafted into the U.S. Army. When Burl returned home from World War II, he enrolled at the University of MissouriColumbia in pre-veterinary medicine. Burl graduated from the University of Missouri-Columbia in 1952 with a Bachelor Degree in Agriculture and as a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine.

Burl opened his first practice at 1750 S. Campbell in Springfield, Missouri under the name of "Cottage Veterinary Hospital". Now, fifty-one years later the "Cottage Veterinary Hospital" is still an active practice under the ownership of Burl's son Dr. Michael B. Pfander.

On September 5, 1948 Burl was united in marriage to Reba M. Lanz who survives him. Burl was a lifetime member of both the American Veterinary Medical Association and the Missouri Veterinary Medical Association. Burl was an associate member of the American Animal Hospital Association, the Southwest Missouri Veterinary Medical Association, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and

the American Legion. Burl also served on the Board and was an active volunteer in the Nixa Sucker Day celebration for many years. Burl was a member of James River Chapel Church of Christ. In December 2001, Burl was honored as an inductee into the MO Hereford Association "Hall of Fame".

The true worth of a man is his unselfishness, the way he lives his life among his fellow man; judged by the standards of loyalty, honesty and decency. Dr. Burl Pfander lived the simple life he loved, by practicing veterinary medicine in the "Ozark Hills" among the people that he loved. But, he left his "mark" in the hearts of his fellow man, both young and old, with his quiet Christian manner, and his common way of life in the "Ozark Hills". He preferred his life born, reared and educated in Missouri with his active mind and keen intellect. He believed strongly in education and established several scholarships for young people in Missouri. In the actualness of reality, these are the true qualities that measure a Man".
