Life Of Wayne Rees

Wayne Rees was born at the farmhouse of his grandparents, who immigrated from Germany circa 1885, Joseph and Katie Haas Weng, located one-mile North and a little West of Avilla, Missouri, September 1, 1913. There used to be a red barn with white batting strips on the knoll over there West of the Avilla Cemetery. He grew up with his brothers, Freeman, Elden and Earl and sister, Katherine on the farm of his parents Robert Lee and Julia Weng Rees two and one half miles West of Dudenville.

He married Una Mae Pfeifer, September 11, 1943, and they purchased the farm from his parents, Robert Lee and Julia Rees who had purchased the farm from his parental grandparents, Freeman and Sarah Knecht Rees. Wayne and Una Mae raised their family, Doris, Karen, Robert and Roger there, where both sons farmed for a while and Robert Wayne Rees and family continue to farm.
