Clifton Otis Williams, 75, died at 9:47 a.m., Saturday, February 26, 2000, at Freeman Hospital West, Joplin, Missouri. He was born September 20, 1924, at Steele, Missouri, to Luther Henry Williams and Sallie L. Clark Williams and had lived in Barton County forty years. He was a World War II Army veteran, had served in the South Pacific and had received two Purple Hearts. Clifton was a retired Missouri Conservation Agent, a member of Lamar Masonic Lodge #292 and a member of the Eastern Star, Mt. Hope Chapter # 74. He married Imogene Hobbs, July 12, 1946, at Pocahontas, Arkansas. She survives.
